



RESTORING HOPE, FEEDING THE HUNGRY, EMPOWERING THE OPPRESSED

For 75 years, One Great Hour of Sharing has provided Presbyterians a way to share God's love with our neighbors in need around the world. The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People - all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope. Typically received during the season of Lent, each gift to One Great Hour of Sharing supports efforts to relieve hunger through the Presbyterian Hunger Program, promote development through the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People, and assist in areas of disaster through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.

HAVE YOU HEARD?

Our church Fellowship Hall was the site of the annual Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast for Habitat for Humanity of Citrus County (HFH). Over 100 people came, which consisted of the two ReStores, the Habitat office, building site workers, and those individuals, businesses, and organizations that contribute toward making a house a home. Many of those serving the volunteers were family members partnering with our local Habitat affiliate to realize their dream of owning their own home. Our church family was presented a plaque celebrating 25 years of supporting Habitat for Humanity of Citrus County. Our emphasis, since 2008 and HFH home #37, has been to present each Habitat family with a brand new washer and dryer upon the dedication ceremony of their home. HFH home #256 was just dedicated, so that's over 225 washers and dryers ago! It's a big mission! Our church has an ongoing designated mission account for HFH W&D fund, #8545.

Also of note — Our own Vicki Oorbeck is part of a group of ladies that make an individual handmade quilt for each family that has reached the goal of a brand new Habitat home. Consider joining these quilters to create a treasure that can be handed down from generation to generation.

Our local HFH affiliate anticipates completing 15 homes in 2024. That's a whole lotta washers, dryers, and quilts! Thank you, church family for being part of showing the love of Christ in practical ways.


